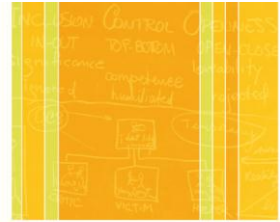

The Story of Who We Are

We all tell stories to ourselves about who we are, where we come from, and where we are going. We all tell stories about who other people are and whether they are helpful or harmful. We all tell stories about whether the world is hostile or friendly. These inner narratives (schema, beliefs, frames) in turn shape our self-concept and how we perceive other people and define the world. In the Human Element program we touch briefly on our personal stories when we do the life-line exercise. In the Radical Collaboration work we touch on our stories when we do the "conflict" life line. This year's enrichment seminar will give us a chance to go deeper. We will explore various lifelong themes and story lines in our own lives in order to open to deeper levels of self-discovery and self-understanding. We will also be developing our own capacity for non-dual resonance as we listen to others.

The agenda will include:

Mindfulness meditation and non-dual awareness exercises.

Extended Story Line Exercise is based on aspects of Narrative therapy, Voice therapy, Dialogue Therapy, Inner-subjective conscious theory and Life Story Research.

Several Gestalt techniques and Personification methods to explore and integrate themes that arise from the review of our personal histories.

An overall PACE attitude will be encouraged during the event:

Play

Acceptance

Curiosity

Empathy

Bio information on Ron Luyet

Ron Luyet is a founder and principle of the Green Zone Consulting Group and a Senior Consultant with the Japanese based global consulting firm Business Consultants Inc. He has worked with Fortune 500 companies around the world for over 30 years with an emphasis on emotional intelligence for executives and creating more collaborative work environments in organizations. His clients have include private sector companies like Boeing, Seagram, Procter and Gamble and public sector organizations such as the United Nations, NASA, US Dept. of Defense and the National Cancer Institute. He regularly presents an 8 day Executive Leaders Program for Japanese CEOs and Presidents focused on social intelligence or Ningen-Ryoku "Human Power".



He is a master group facilitator whose classic instruction came from such group dynamics pioneers as Carl Rogers and Will Schutz. Ron knew Dr. Schutz for forty years, and worked closely with him in the design of The Human Element® program and delivery of the Advanced Human Element Certification program which he still conducts. Ron co-designed with Jim Tamm the Radical Collaboration® Training Program now offered around the world which is the basis for the Harper Collins bestselling book *Radical Collaboration: Five Essential Skills to Overcome Defensiveness and Build Successful Relationships*. The Radical Collaboration training materials have been translated into 14 languages.

Ron co-founded The Institute for Personal Change in San Francisco, which provides a structured, intensive therapeutic program for people exploring the impact of childhood on adult behavior. Ron's work is described in his book, co-authored with Marion Pastor, titled "Where Freedom Begins".

Ron's early career was in the field of drug treatment and prevention. He was Chairman of the Palo Alto Community Drug Abuse & Prevention Programs. Ron has long been a student of meditation and comparative religions and is interested in the blending of western psychology with eastern introspective methods. He was introduced to contemplative practice by Allan Watts in the 60s and has studied with many in the transpersonal field including, Ram Dass, Muktanadna, Oscar Ichazo, Ralph Meszner, James Fadiman, Steven Levine, and Choayam Trungpa.
